Mary Small writes:

I have several hobbies, but the one I'm most focused on right now is jewelry making, but most of it isn't what you'd call traditional. I make most of my products out of silver plate flatware. I also make bezel cups from silver and set cabochon stones in them for pendants.

Many years ago, I was introduced to an artist who made jewelry from flatware, and she shared some of her techniques with me. Since then, I've taken a couple basic soldering and jewelry making classes.



Some of my favorite tools are a drill press, a flex-shaft and a ring bender. Having the right tools makes things go so much easier and results in reduced injuries! Often, I let the flatware or cabochon speak to me to determine what to make.

Other times I need a little inspiration, so I look at Pinterest



and Etsy. Finding the "right" flatware is sometimes a challenge, but I love the hunt in antique stores, flea markets and online sources.



My husband Gary and I have a little business (Katherine's Kreations – Katherine is my middle name) and we have a booth at the Larimer County Farmer's Market in Fort Collins on Saturdays. We'll also be at a craft show in Fort Collins August 7 and 8. I have an Etsy store, but it is going to have to wait for further updating till market season is over!



Friends of the Loveland Public Library is a nonprofit organization which focuses its all-volunteer power on fundraising and advocacy. It funds and sponsors programs that engage people of all ages with the array of resources and technology available at our library, to help our growing community increase their literacy skills. The Friends achieve that mission primarily through sales of donated books, largely at its bi-annual book sales held at The Ranch. The Friends also operate the **Chapter Two Bookstore** year round inside the library and member **Ellen Shepherd** manages the volunteers at this store. There are several ways you could support Friends. You can become a member of Friends for a small annual fee (\$10 for an individual and \$15 for a family).

Many FUMC members are long-time and active Friends' volunteers. Scores of volunteers are needed for the bi-annual sale and other volunteer opportunities arise intermittently. FUMC CHARGE CONFERENCE COMMITTEES

For those of you that are interested in learning more about the FUMC Committees that are listed in the Charge Conference Booklet on our Website, here are the last 8 of the 13 Committees descriptions from each Chairman as to the Committee's purpose. Committee members listed are appointed in the Fall by the Nominations Committee to serve.

The Nominations Committee is responsible for contacting the FUMC congregation and asking if they will serve on a committee. SAFETY & SECURITY COMMITTEE

The Safety and Security Committee was formed in response to several Church Council requests (2008, 2012, & 2017) for a Trustees team to look at what could & should be done to improve personal safety of those in and around our facility. Our membership is largely hand selected for specific expertise or representation. Consequently, Safety & Security is listed as "specialized - no classes" and members are not automatically rotated off after three years. Members are allowed to serve as long as they are willing to serve and only then replaced by the Nominating Committee. They identify and address personal safety issues from trimming shrubs and trees up off the ground to eliminate hiding spots, exterior lighting to eliminate total darkness on the North and East sides of the building, missing stair rail wall returns, tornado shelter, and exit signs to trailer safety & maintenance, etc. They also set up design, justification, funding, and installation of our building access control, security, video, and intercom systems, wrote the justification for and secured parking lot replacement funding, and drove replacement of outdated (vulnerable to hacker attacks) wireless routers and Windows 10 upgrades to all FUMC computers for IT security purposes.


